

DEADLINES FOR WILDFIRE ASSISTANCE

Disaster Recovery Centers (DRC)

If you or anyone you know has been affected by the recent wildfires in Southern California, act before the **March 31st deadline**. Whether it is debris removal, financial assistance, or individual aid, there are resources available to help. If you need assistance or have questions visit a **Disaster Recovery Center (DRC)**. There are two (2) centers dedicated to getting help to wildfire survivors. The DRCs are open Monday through Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and are located at:

Individual Assistance (IA)

These programs cover a wide range of assistance available for wildfire survivors. Time is running out to apply. You may be eligible for some or all these programs. **Even if you received an "ineligible" letter, you may still be able to get assistance after providing additional information.** You can get help at a Disaster Recovery Center (DRC) listed above. Small Business Administration (SBA) Loan

These loans are offered by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) to help disaster survivors and provide long-term, low-interest disaster loans to homeowners, renters, businesses, and private nonprofits in declared major disaster areas. It covers losses not fully compensated by insurance or other resources. You **DO NOT** need to own a business to apply for SBA assistance. Note: You do not need to accept a loan at the time of application. This is the first step in the process to apply for a loan but must be applied for on or before March 31, 2025.



DEADLINE: MONDAY, MARCH 31, 2025

Residential Property Owner Right of Entry (ROE)

To have debris removed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), a Right of Entry form (ROE) must be submitted to the County by the property owner. There is no out-of-pocket cost to have debris removed by USACE. Those who elect to opt out of the government managed debris removal program and conduct the work on their own still need to complete the opt-out form. **The final deadline for submitting forms is April 15, 2025.**
